# **Bachelor of Early Childhood Education**

Our Bachelor of Early Childhood Education is your pathway to an exciting career as an early childhood teacher where you will gain a contemporary body of knowledge and skills to educate young children through play pedagogy in a variety of settings and professional roles.

Throughout the first two years of the degree, you will be provided with the opportunity to develop skills in professional practice; play and documentation techniques; holistic child development; inclusion, diversity and equity; safety, health, wellbeing and wellness; documentation, assessment, and planning for 0-6 year olds; creativity; theoretical perspectives and pedagogy; working with families and communities; sustainable practices; pedagogical documentation and contemporary curriculum.

Your third year of study focuses on aspects of early childhood teaching and integrated curriculum across communication, language, and literacy; mathematics and numeracy; digital technologies and media; science, engineering, STEM, and STEAM; music, dance, movement, and drama; and visual and media arts.

In your final year of the degree, you will empower your early childhood teacher identity to nurture the next generation through advocacy, social justice and children's rights education; First Nations Peoples perspectives; contemporary curriculum; inclusivity and trauma practices, educational leadership and service management; and research in early childhood education.

Throughout the degree, you will also actively engage in four professional experience placements in a variety of early childhood education settings that will develop your teaching practice with young children and provide the knowledge, confidence and practical experience to enter the workforce upon graduating. The Bachelor of Early Childhood Education will prepare you to be a competent, skilled, and transformative early childhood teacher.

This qualification is recognised in the Australian Qualifications Framework.



# PROFESSIONAL ACCREDITATION

The Bachelor of Early Childhood Education is recognised by the Australian Children's Education & Care Quality Authority (ACECQA) as an approved early childhood qualification for Early Childhood Teachers under the National Quality Framework. Graduates will be eligible for early childhood teacher accreditation recognition via their State Regulatory Authority.

#### **CAREER OPPORTUNITIES**

The course prepares graduates for an exciting career as an early childhood teacher with the skills to educate children from birth to transitioning to school across a variety of early childhood settings, as well as professional and community roles within the sector.

#### **RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING**

Recognition of Prior Learning determines the extent to which a student has achieved the learning outcomes of a subject from earlier learning, experience or achievements. Graduates of a vocational CHC50113 or CHC50121 Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care qualification will be eligible for entry into second year.

#### **DELIVERY**

Course delivery is a combination of lectures, tutorials, self-directed study and professional experience placements. You should allow for approximately 3 hours per subject for lectures and tutorials. For each subject, you should then spend approximately 10 hours per week for self-directed study to complete prescribed readings, practice skills, research, study and complete assessments.

#### **INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**

International applicants must have an English Language Proficiency Score of IELTS 6.5 (Academic) with Speaking no less than 6.5; Listening, Writing and Reading no less than 6.0, or equivalent. 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#### **ADMISSION PATHWAYS**

#### **Academic Admission Criteria**

- Applicants with recent Senior Secondary Education (within the past two years) must have completed an Australian Senior Secondary Certificate (Year 12) or equivalent. For quaranteed entry applicants must have achieved an ATAR of 60 with a minimum of a NSW Band 4 in English (or equivalent).
- Applicants with Higher Education (HE) study must have undertaken a higher education qualification (or at least a semester of study).
- Applicants with Vocational Education and Training (VET) study must have completed a vocational qualification at Diploma level or higher.
- Applicants with Work/Life experience who left senior secondary education more than two years prior to their application, and have not undertaken VET or HE study since, may gain entry based on professional or work experience and/or any non-formal courses undertaken in preparation for tertiary study or that are relevant to the subject area. Work/Life experience applicants must submit a written admission statement outlining their reasons for undertaking the intended course of study.

### Non-Academic Admission Criteria

Applicants must submit an Initial Teacher Education Teaching Statement demonstrating their suitability to teaching with the right mix of qualities to enable them to become an effective early childhood teacher, and may be required to participate in an informal interview.

#### **COURSE STRUCTURE**

The course consists of 32 subjects including four placement subjects. You must successfully complete all subjects to graduate with the Bachelor (192 credit points). As part of the degree, you will actively engage in a minimum of 80 days of professional experience across four placements to develop your teaching practice with young children. Your final placement will give you the opportunity to consolidate your pedagogical and leadership practice, and the confidence and practical experience to enter the profession as a graduate level Australian Professional Standards for Teachers early childhood teacher.
